SUBJ: Maryland Wing Cadet Flight Training Scholarship

Maryland Wing has allocated funding in Fiscal Year 2008 for cadet flight training leading to an FAA private pilot certificate. These funds will be used to defray the costs for cadets receiving flight training in CAP aircraft. The Wing Commander will determine the distribution of the funds and the number of scholarships awarded based on applications received. In order to be eligible for the scholarship, cadets must

- a. have earned the Billy Mitchell Award,
- b. have earned their Solo Wings through MD Wing Solo School, National Flight Academy, or any other method, and
- c. have not received or been selected for a similar scholarship or grant.

Eligible cadets must submit their application package no later than 30 September 07 to Wing HQ, ATTN: Lt. Col. John Knowles, MD Wing Vice Commander. It should include

- a. A resume of your CAP career
- b. proof of academic standing (latest report card or college transcript)
- c. A one-page essay explaining your career and CAP goals and how the flight training scholarship will support them.
- d. Documentation of medical certificate, date of solo flight, and total number hours of flight training. (copies of logbook pages will suffice)
- e. Letter of recommendation from your flight instructor or another individual of your choice.

Incomplete application packages will not be considered.

Applications must be forward through the squadron and group chain of command. Squadron and group commanders should endorse or not endorse each application. Multiple applications from any unit should be rank-ordered by the unit commander in the endorsement. The Vice Commander will chair a board to review all applications and provide recommendations to the Wing Commander.
